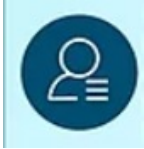

Harris County - Current Level of Risk
Level 1: SEVERE - Stay Home Work Safe



On June 26th, Harris County Judge Lina Hidalgo raised the **Current Level of Risk** for Harris County from **Level 2** to **Level 1**.

Level 1 signifies a severe and uncontrolled level of COVID-19 in Harris County, meaning **outbreaks are present and worsening** and that testing and contact tracing capacity is strained or exceeded. At this level, residents take action to **minimize contacts with others wherever possible and avoid leaving home except for the most essential needs** like going to the grocery store for food and medicine. Regardless of current level indicated, all residents should continue the use of social distancing, frequent hand washing, and the use of face coverings until there is a vaccine or a treatment for the virus. Additionally, residents exposed to COVID-19 should quarantine for 14 days regardless of level indicated.

EARLY VOTING IN PROGRESS NOW!



This July, you can vote at any polling location in Harris County during Early Voting and on Election Day. Find a location near you at HarrisVotes.com.

What you'll need to vote

Make sure you bring one of these accepted forms of identification:

- Texas Driver License issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS)
- Texas Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS
- Texas Personal Identification Card issued by DPS
- Texas Handgun License issued by DPS
- United States Military Identification Card containing the person's photograph
- United States Citizenship Certificate containing the person's photograph
- United States Passport (book or card)

Don't have an acceptable form of ID?

If a voter does not possess and cannot reasonably obtain a photo ID, they may still cast a regular ballot by presenting a supporting form of ID and executing a Reasonable Impediment Declaration, noting the voter's reasonable impediment to obtaining an acceptable form of photo identification.

About the ballot

- Voters in the Texas primaries and conventions choose who will run for office in the November General Elections.
- Find your specific sample ballot at HarrisVotes.com. The items on your ballot may vary depending on which area of the county you reside.
- In Texas, a registered voter may vote in either the Republican Primary Election or the Democratic Primary Election (NOT both) during the same voting year.
- When you go vote, you can bring a marked sample ballot or a Voters Guide into the voting booth with you.
