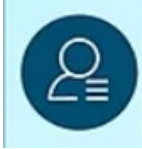

Harris County COVID-19 Threat Level System

Current Level:

Level 1: SEVERE - Stay Home



Level 1 signifies a severe and uncontrolled level of COVID-19 in Harris County, meaning **outbreaks are present and worsening** and that testing and contact tracing capacity is strained or exceeded. At this level, residents take action to **minimize contacts with others wherever possible and avoid leaving home except for the most essential needs** like going to the grocery store for food and medicine.

Regardless of current level indicated, all residents should continue the use of social distancing, frequent hand washing, and the use of face coverings until there is a vaccine or a treatment for the virus. Additionally, residents exposed to COVID-19 should quarantine for 14 days regardless of level indicated.

2020 Important Election Dates

Tuesday, November 3, 2020 - Uniform Election Date

Last Day to Register to Vote	Monday, October 5, 2020*
First Day of Early Voting by Personal Appearance	Tuesday, October 13, 2020
Last Day to Apply for Ballot by Mail (Received, not Postmarked)	Friday, October 23, 2020
Last Day of Early Voting by Personal Appearance	Friday, October 30, 2020
Last day to Receive Ballot by Mail	Tuesday, November 3, 2020 (Election Day) at 7:00 p.m. if carrier envelope is not postmarked, OR Wednesday, November 4, 2020 (next business day after Election Day) at 5:00 p.m. if carrier envelope is postmarked by 7:00 p.m. at the location of the election on Election Day (unless overseas or military voter deadlines apply) ⁴
